- a. Procurement is *Design-Bid-Build* not Design-Build an excerpt from FTA Circular 42201.F, page 7 was provided clarifying the definitions of each type of procurement and specifying this is a Design-Bid-Build.
- b. Clarify Task 1, Task 2 and Task 3 (separate billing/invoicing) Bommelman explained each of the three tasks were being funded separately and how tasks can overlap if it is the most beneficial.
- c. Ensure all required documents are submitted with proposal Bommelman reminded everyone to ensure they submitted all required

documentation per the RFP; there was a clarification direct wages for construction functions are covered by Davis-Bacon and will need to be documented, including contractor interviews, as required. The design firm is not covered by Davis-Bacon.

h. Cooperative Agreement means an instrument by which FTA awards Federal assistance to a specific recipient to support a particular project in which FTA takes an active role or retains substantial control, as described in 31 U.S.C. Section 6305.

(i.)

<u>Design-Bid-Build Project</u> means a construction project under which a recipient commissions an architect or engineer to prepare drawings and specifications under a design services contract, and separately contracts for construction, by engaging the services <u>of</u> a contractor through sealed bidding or competitive negotiations to complete delivery of the project.

- j. <u>Design-Build Project</u>, as defined in 49 U.S.C. Section 5325(d)(1), means (1) a project under which a recipient enters into a contract with a seller, firm, or consortium of firms to design and build a public transportation system, or an operable segment of such system, that conforms to specific performance criteria; and (2) may include an option to finance, or operate for a period of time, the system or segment or any combination of designing, building, operating, or maintaining such system or segment. Apart from the definition at 49 U.S.C. Section 5325(d)(1), a "design-build project" also means a construction project under which a recipient enters into a contract with a seller, firm, or consortium of firms both to design and construct a public transportation facility that is the subject of the project.
- k. <u>Electronic Commerce (E-Commerce)</u> consists of electronic techniques for accomplishing business transactions including electronic mail or messaging, World Wide Web internet technology, electronic bulletin boards, purchase cards, electronic funds transfer, electronic signatures, and electronic data interchange.
- Force Account means the recipient's own labor forces and equipment, as discussed in this circular in the context of performing project work.
- m. FTA means the Federal Transit Administration.
- n. Full and Open Competition means that all responsible sources are permitted to compete.
- o. Governmental Recipient means a recipient that must comply with the Common Grant Rule at 49 CFR Part 18. This includes a State or local government or a federally recognized Indian tribal government, as defined in this section of this Chapter.
- p. Grant means the instrument by which FTA awards Federal assistance to a specific recipient to support a particular project in which FTA does not take an active role or retain substantial control, as described in 31 U.S.C. Section 6304.
